Story of Ganga retold

Artistes from Singapore and India collaborate on a unique production called Dhaara



SAMARPANA, the Asian Festival of Classical Dance, will come to a close on Sept 7 and its grand finale will be a performance called Dhaara – The Flow of Divinity. Dhaara is a confluence of bharatanaytam and street theatre and specially commissioned for this year's Samarpana.

This production is a joint effort by Singapore-based school of dance Shru-ti Laya, theatre company WeCanDoIt and the Mudrika Foundation of Indian Performing Arts from Bangalore.

Dhaara – The Flow of Divinity traces the journey of Ganga, the nymph who made her way to earth through Lord Shiva's dreadlocks to wash away the sins of mankind.

This production is an innovative confluence of

two disciplines of classical dance and English theatre that trace the mythical and geographical journey of the mighty river.

The contemporary stories of day-to-day life portrayed in casual street theatre are juxtaposed against the narrative of mythology in bharatanatyam.
